

At our **May monthly meeting** we welcome **Elizabeth Gowing.** Resident in London, we have made special arrangements for her to be with us on **Wednesday 8th May at Emmanuel Church at 2.30 pm** - although we may be slightly late starting if the roads are busy.

Elizabeth is the author of four books about the Balkans, a frequent lecturer to groups in the UK and a regular contributor to Radio 4's "From Our Own Correspondent". She has translated two books from Albanian to English and divides her time between Albania, the UK and Kosovo, where she co-founded the Ideas Partnership charity. The last few years have also brought speaking engagements at the Albanian Presidency at the invitation of the First Lady, in London at the Royal Anthropological Institute, at the London Book Fair and the American Embassy, Prishtina, a lifeboat station and a jazz club.

She is probably best known for her book "The Rubbish Picker's Wife" but for us she is featuring her latest book. 'Unlikely positions in unlikely places; a yoga journey around the UK' tells the stories from her explorations of yoga. She says that she is not a likely yogini; too fond of chocolate and To-do lists, and sometimes she falls over on her mat. So this is not a 'how to' talk - it's given by an explorer rather than an expert. Sometimes funny, sometimes touching, it evokes the characters and communities met along a fascinating journey, from doga (yes, yoga with your dog) to

her dripping day of 'hot yoga', hanging upside down in aerial yoga, to yoga in prisons and with asylum-seekers, children and Stand-Up Paddleboards.

It will be of interest to those who love Britain – its quirkiness and multi-layered communities, from inner city community centres to exclusive spas. It will also be loved by the 'armchair yogini' and the armchair traveller. It's a light introduction to some mind-bending ways that ancient positions can find new homes, and ordinary and extraordinary people in crisis can find peace and a sense of belonging.


